Ex. 3 Note that these font styles can be combined as well.

A bold and italic text line (bi)

An underlined and italic text line (ui)

A bold , underlined and italic text line (bui)

Works also with floating titles

NOTE

(r) The regular (normal) font style can only be used if the default value is set differently, e.g. to bold
 Otherwise it's the default anyway.
