

A text line can be centered, left or right aligned.

The default is left alignment.

Use a double space to "push" the text to the next column.

**See these Examples**

**Ex.1 Single column**

**Ex.2 Two columns**

Left	Center	
Left		Right
	Center	Right

**Ex.3 Three columns**

Left	Center	Right
------	--------	-------

**A border is only added to the first non-empty column**

<b>Left</b>		
	<b>Center</b>	
		<b>Right</b>
<b>Left</b>	Center	
<b>Left</b>		Right
	<b>Center</b>	Right
<b>Left</b>	Center	Right

**The center column gets adjusted to the space available**

If there is a very long text in the left column                      CENTER                      RIGHT

LEFT                      CENTER                      If there is a very long text in the right column

A long text in the left column                      And a long text in the center                      RIGHT

LEFT                      A long text in the center                      And a long text in the right column

**But of course - if there is too much text it will overlap**

A long text in the left column                      A long text in the center                      A long text in the right column

Typical usage is to add additional annotations to song parts

Some examples ...

A Campfire Song

(written by "Artist A")

as played by "Artist B"

Chorus

(with ad-libs)

... without keys ...

Chorus

no backing vocals !!!

with acoustic guitar and bass only

Chorus
