

Typical usage is to add additional annotations to song parts

Some examples ...

A Campfire Song

(written by "Artist A")

as played by "Artist B"

Chorus

(with ad-libs)

|| G | ♯ | C | D ||

Verse

... without keys ...

|| Am | C | Am | D ||

Chorus

no backing vocals !!!

|| G | ♯ | C | D ||

Verse

with acoustic guitar and bass only

|| Am | C | Am | D ||

Chorus

"bass & drums only"

|| G | ♯ | C | D ||

Verse

with ah-uh-ah backing vocals

|| Am | C | Am | D ||

A text line can be centered, left or right aligned.

The default is left alignment.

Use a double space to "push" the text to the next column.

See these Examples

Ex.1 Single column

Left	Center	Right
------	--------	-------

Ex.2 Two columns

Left	Center	
Left		Right
	Center	Right

Ex.3 Three columns

Left	Center	Right
------	--------	-------

A border is only added to the first non-empty column

Left	Center	Right
Left	Center	
Left		Right
	Center	Right
Left	Center	Right

The center column gets adjusted to the space available

If there is a very long text in the left column **CENTER** **RIGHT**

LEFT **CENTER** If there is a very long text in the right column

A long text in the left column And a long text in the center **RIGHT**

LEFT A long text in the center And a long text in the right column

But of course - if there is too much text it will overlap

A long text in the left column A long text in the center A long text in the right column
